
Lockton Remembered

Our mother, Ruth Strong, published Lockton Remembered in 2000. It is an oral history of Lockton people recalling what day to day life was like in the village. She started recordings of people's memories in the early 1980s and with her tape recorder captured the voices and memories of 32 members of the Lockton community, some going as far

back as the First World War.

The book has been out of print for a number of years and there are few copies remaining so there is a danger that these memories will be lost forever. Consequently her family are working on republishing it with a launch in 2024.

A number of the photos in the book were supplied by the contributors who kindly agreed for them to be published and we intend to include these photos in the re-print.
