Buckingham Palace announces the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebration Plans

On 6 February 2022, the Queen will become the first British monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, marking a 70-year reign. A recent study showed that for 85% of the population she is the only monarch they have known. The first week in June has been chosen for the celebratory weekend, with summer offering a better chance of good weather than February.



To celebrate the four-day weekend, the late May Spring Bank Holiday will be moved to 2 June and an additional oneoff bank holiday on 3 June created. Lockton Parish Council intend hosting a series of events to mark the occasion, including a Garden Fete, planting tree saplings in line with the Queen's Green Canopy initiative and judging a Queen's Pudding competition!
