

Proposal for the WI to convert the village bus shelter

In summary, the proposal was made by the WI, to adapt the bus shelter by installing a door to the entrance, with the aim to attract habitat for insects, birds and possibly bats whilst enhancing wildlife. The door would have an appropriate gap at the top to allow access. Cost of this will be mainly funded by the WI, and some costs may be covered by the National Park's Biodiversity project "GrubsUp!". The full proposal which was discussed at the June Parish Council meeting is attached. Ongoing maintenance for the changes made would be the responsibility of the WI, maintenance for the bus shelter structure including the roof, would be the responsibility of the Parish Council.

Proposal for the NY Moors National Parks to develop a Community Orchard

In summary, the proposal was submitted by the NYMNPA following discussions between the Parks and the Parish Council, with the intention to create a Community Orchard and wild flower meadow on the land adjacent to the village cricket pitch and Lockton cemetery. This would be mainly funded by the GrubsUp! Project, with the aim of it being a community-led project, and will involve the planting of local provenance fruit trees, to include new fencing and hedgerows with the aim to create a floristically rich area, and enhance wildlife. The full proposal which was discussed at the June Parish Council meeting is attached. Ongoing maintenance would be the responsibility of the community volunteers.

Proposal for a resident to develop a further Biodiversity area

In summary, the proposal was made by a Lockton resident who wishes to create an area for both public and private use, with the intention of complementing the GrubsUp! Community Orchard and meadow. The public area would contain UK native planting, a couple of small pond areas and a mowed path, with the aim of creating a biodiverse and restful place. The private space would be for planting fruit trees, adding a hedge and a small area for allotment purposes. The full proposal which was discussed at the June Parish Council meeting is attached. Ongoing maintenance would be the responsibility of both volunteers and the private tenant. To note, a nominal rental fee will be paid for this area, which provides a rental income to the Parish Council.
