Transport

6a Difficulty getting to services outside the parish?

Have to use car no services, no public transport available

My wife has Parkinson's Disease and is unable to drive anymore and has great difficulty walking

Poor if no bus service!

Owning transport is essential in order to have a job and be able to live in Lockton, Public services are devisary!

Car share so sometimes need to depend on bus

Bus not convenient times in the morning, can't get to Pickering in the morning

With only 3 -4 buses a day into Pickering – it's not possibly to get a real good experience of shopping, events or meeting up with others; attending appointments can take a lot longer; attending evening events is not possible

I need to rely on family & neighbours who are not always available to take me. Ryecat are very good but not always able to to take on last minute appointments. Taxis are expensive. I can't walk to the bus stop because of problems with my legs. The service is poor anyway

8 Car Parking

Neighbours opposite insist on parking on the road

Not always an issue, weekends when more holiday home cars appear

Some cars from residents and holiday makers obstruct traffic coming into and out of the village.

Some cars are parked dangerously

Cars park on both sides of road

Cars parking for shop and Lockton & Levisham shoot(?) can be annoying if not done sensitively

Cars parked at open end of cul-de-sac (close to Tea Room) present a real danger to driver who wish to get to their houses in the cul-de-sac. These drivers are forced to veer to the wrong side of the village road in order to do so causing the possibility of a head-on collision with a vehicle coming from the direction of Levisham

Home owners who park cars on the road despite having driveways/garages to put them in. There are many such

Makes access difficult at times – can be dangerous because of visibility, especially when most properties can access their own off road parking

Occasionally have to drive on Green to avoid parked cars

Define problem: If you mean are parked cars a problem to us going about our daily lives the answer i no. If you mean: are the plethora of cars parked in the village and surrounding areas sometimes an eyesore? Then the answer is Yes

On a few occasions cars/campervans park on the path outside the Youth Hostel causing difficulties for us to access our drive - get our cars in and out.

Vehicles using Youth Hostel park opposite my garage and cause obstruction

Youth Hostel residents parking opposite Jasmine Cottage, parking opposite car already there so can't drive through the gap

Owners should park cars off road when they have facility to do so and not block neighbours access to their parking.

Cars parked in village should not park near road junctions

Parking on the grass verges should be discouraged especially in winter when the ground is soft & susceptible to damage

The pavement directly outside our cottage is permanently used as a parking space by a local resident. The village green is also used for parking at times which should not happen

In the narrow road cars parked opposite drive make access difficult - an occasional problem

Moving machinery to do with work Trying to drive tractors through village

Whilst it is appreciated that many owners do not have anywhere to park their vehicles off the street, where properties do have provision for off street parking many don't use it and the village street resembles an urban estate. Also vehicles park illegally at road junctions

Sometimes parked on the pavement

When attending Church events

Back road to the Square is often parked up round the bend so that it is hazardous to drive round that bend

On street parking in winter can be a problem when people don't use their off street parking

9 Other comments on Transport

Public transport not good enough for morning appointments, earliest bus after midday to York

Still need the bus transport for other members of village

What transport?

Poor limited bus service

Bus should come into village as it used to

The bus would be better used if it came into the village as it used to. It is a long way for people to walk to the main road especially with bags and limited mobility

No public transport to speak of for the young people or non-car drivers

Only use bus very occasionally. I would use it more if it was more frequent

More frequent service would allow visitors to use bus to get here

For older people it is a shame it no longer comes into the village itself to make bus more accessible

Also use NYMR from Levisham

There is no excuse for vehicles parking on the pavement or on the various village greens

A cycle track from Whitby to Pickering would be excellent – especially with more people getting electric bikes

To catch a bus we now have to endure noise, pollution and danger from the traffic on the fast A169, have no protection from the weather & constant anxiety about whether the bus will stop at the designated bus stop or go right past it because it was going too fast (especially as it come round a bend with little time to see the bus stop)

Housing

10 Need for additional housing in Lockton?

Cost prohibitive for families

Starter homes for young families

Need to have housing suitable for young people and families to create a better mix within the community

More affordable housing We think younger people & families can't afford housing in Lockton

Increased population leading to; improved services; reduction in average age; helping requirement for more housing in UK

Where are the low cost houses to encourage young families to come and live with us in Lockton? Or am I the only one who thinks it is beneficial

I don't know whether there are local people who would like to remain but are priced out!

I don't feel able to judge

But we would welcome eg. Housing Association scheme to enable local young people to live in village

The village has no village feeling, more houses – more people – more socialising. Then there would be more use of areas eg. play area, VH

Families that have been born here can't afford to stay which is a shame

11. Members of household with housing needs?

3 children

Next generation

Possibly in the distant future

As I will be looking to move out from my parents

Possible move to sheltered accomodation

12. Directly benefit from local affordable housing in next 5 yrs

Affordable Housing would benefit me as houses are affordable only to the rich in Lockton & Levisham

Other comments on housing

Sad appearance of satellite dishes on the front of properties within the village, in appropriate and unsightly & as far as informed <u>not</u> allowed!

Let's have some dynamic designer houses in Lockton!

There is no shortage of housing for sale but little in the first time buyer bracket. Not an encouragement for young families to settle in the village

Not sure what will happen in the next 5 years

Houses left to fall down or not finished and no one living in them, where are the National Park when this happens? Eg. Rose Cottage and Saltergate Pub

It seems Lockton has become a niche market to home owners/buyers which has changed the overall outlook of the village. The community spirit seems to have disappeared

Church Graveyard and Cemetery

Important to you? Other

Not at all

A number of Ryedale Churches supply facilities for making tea would this be a possibility at Lockton? - there are a lot of walkers going through

We would like to see it playing a much bigger part in the community

The Church has the potential to become a focal point for the village

Any Other comments on Church, Graveyard and Cemetery

The wildlife area is a mess Looks messy

As long as weed control is practised in the 'Wildflower area' as this would make it look messy

Not necessary with the addition of Robinson's field to the village and this area look untidy and full of rubbish.

Cemetery needs to be quiet and tidy space out of respect for those people <u>visiting</u> graves of loved ones

I have been part of the mini meadow project and feel it is very worthwhile

Hope to get married at Lockton or Ellerburn Church

Wildflower area – this is not suitably marked and therefore makes the cemetery look "unkempt" and uncared for

The so-called wildflower area looks an untidy mess for most of the year, has few wild flowers & is a disgrace to the cemetery. The fields & woods within the parish have an abundance of naturally growing wild flowers

Can the Churchyard be left as a 'meadow' & only cut when the flowers have seeded?

Having the sheep graze in the Churchyard is a good idea

Good to see sheep used in the Churchyard

Usually well looked after

I feel there are better places for a wildflower area than the graveyard/cemetery, like verges and they should be managed as well

Looks like it should be cut for hay, not a tidy sight

There could be other things I would like to support and/or run but these will only happen when communication between Lockton residents improves. More people contributing to the Herald would be a good start

"Yes" - But it depends on what the activity is, of course. More artistic events = yes. Line dancing? = probably not

Future Lockton Artist Exhibitions – help to run and support

Delighted to support events when we are here (by helping to run as well as attending)

Art Events

Meetings, Events, Private parties

If we are staying at our cottage we support local events eg. Lockton Open Artist events. We would happily help at events, particularly to raise funds for the playground

I'm open to helping at events if I'm available

I used to attend events & other activities in the VH but evening events are too tiring these days. Something in the morning or afternoon would be nice for seniors like myself. Eg. Knit & Natter or a suitable class

17. Other comments on Village Hall

Not much demand from hall users for WiFi, need will reduce as data use on mobile phones increases. The VH could be promoted more but who would do the extra work required for cleaning/maintenance etc.

Wi-Fi in VH "Beneficial to the residents"? Do you mean it would extend to cover the whole village? If so – and if fast enough – it would be largely beneficial, if only for the VH, then of little overall benefit

Possibly depending on cost

Not a priority for us but would have no objection

It is great and we enjoy events there, the food provided at events is delicious

It's a really nice friendly place.

Good kitchen

A lovely hub for the village community

I think it's vital to the survival of the village

The VH is a positive asset to the village

Village Hall improvements could include; information on the noticeboard about committee meetings & decisions to encourage more use & support; a clear notice informing of the cost of hiring & who to book with

Regular maintenance programme would help? People don't always leave it as they find it

18a Help with Maintenance of Playing field

What would it involve. As non-permanent residents we would like to help with a specific project when we could arrange to be in the village?

Could come to help with work party if on a day we could manage

Don't use but still willing & do help with the maintenance

19 Cricket Field alternative uses?

Keep it for sports

Not had time to consider this but there may be a wide range of (multi) use opportunities

Make the end next to cemetery suitable for car parking for visitors and a picnic area at road end to free up nuisance parking in village and make it easier for walkers etc

Keep it has a usable space for future generations – perhaps as a cricket pitch or extension of cemetery, could be turned into a car park

As the playing field is on the main A169 and the first impression of our village, it should be maintained and kept looking tidy – not a wildflower area!

More people should get involved and keep Cricket Club going

I wouldn't give up on the cricket club too easily, few NYMNP villages have one

It's a shame, it's a perfect cricket field!

Hopefully it will be used for cricket again

I think it should be kept as a field and hopefully one day cricket shall return

Hopefully it will remain as a cricket field for a few years to give chance if it wants to start again

It should continue to be used for recreational use (both the cricket and football areas) Or be used for grazing with an income for the parish. It should not be used as another 'nature area' being wild and overgrown

Grazing for local animals eg. cows, sheep, horses for local people

Football

Boules club

Small Village Show/Fete

Wildflower meadow area and Boules pitch for the residents (recreation area?)

Turtle Dove Project – Community Garden

Community Orchard, wildlife area, pond

Extension of the wildflower area; something to enhance life for older residents such as a natural park/garden area with seating & possibly a small pond

A conservation area where the old football pitch is would benefit both the residents and local wildlife including the endangered Turtle Doves. Richard Baines from NYMNP is keen to help & support. This potential project could be a way of reuniting the community after recent troubles?

19. Any other comments on Playing Field area and Cricket Field

I would like to see them all continue Our soon really enjoys the play park

Needs to be kept tidy as it is the main entrance to the village but would be best used as a play recreation area

Playing field needs updating, funds currently being raised for this

The Play Area needs more regular maintenance

I would be happy to make a 'donation' collection pole for the Play Area, I have done similar for some places in York area for friends at work

I have suggested the installation of an honesty box in the car park of the playground in which users can pop in change – both local residents and visitors to the playground

What is happening with the tennis court?

Would use tennis court but it is a little dilapidated now needs attention

The slide is a bit challenging & potentially dangerous

The Playground is an excellent, much appreciated resource

Money should be raised to pay for maintenance of equipment to bring some items back into use

Could do with some new equipment for play area

If Great Habton CC do use the area it would be nice if Lockton residents could have the use of at least some of this space. Many people seem keen to support a conservation area

Any other comments on Recreation & Leisure

Q20 Do you use the Tearooms

One of the highlights & treasures of Lockton without a doubt

We tend to be out during the day when visiting our cottage. The Bistro nights are always full, booked by the time we are in Lockton, unfortunately. The menu looks amazing

21. Youth Hostel could be used for more community activities

Pavements, Footpaths and Cycle ways

23a Pavements - Happy with condition?

A disgrace and dangerous in places

Pavement outside the Church is a disgrace, very uneven, falling to bits and covered in leaves

Bad near the Church

Outside Church

Uneven path near Church

Needs cleaning - grass encroaching on tarmac - leaves by Church should be cleared

By Church very uneven and often covered with excessive debris

Pavement from village to cemetery needs cropping back, becoming overgrown with grass

Some footpaths need tidying up/resurfacing – eg. going to cemetery and Stones Hill needs doing again

Uneven in places

Who cares for footpath on left-hand side of Quality St?

I do not like to see cars parked, particularly on the pavements

Dog Poo left on pavements

A bit of weeding would be useful, overhanging trees at Churchyard could do with some attention

Mostly they are fine – and suitable and appropriate for a moorland village

Glad that the tree outside the café has been trimmed

Footpath onto the Brow needs cutting back especially in summer

Very uneven from village square going east on left hand side

Poor maintenance of pavements by NYCC eg. by Church to Cemetery.

Poor state of pavement kerbs throughout the village. Grass growing onto pavements by Cherry Tree Farm

The path is slippery under the tree opposite the bus shelter – debris allowed to build up

24a. Footpaths & Bridleways – Well maintained and accessible?

Footpath starting at top end of main st cul-de-sac is overgrown in summer much of the time

Difficult to say exactly where but quite a few are overgrown

Where we live there is no path – dangerous walking on the road with the dog. 'Slow' signs would help. Cars go too fast

The footpath down the Howl is regularly overgrown and difficult to walk down

General poor state of repair Adequate

Staindale - stiles really difficult for dogs

Some badly damaged by motorbike use

Brow top gets very overgrown Some are overgrown, eg. on Brow, down path to Wedlands

Many are overgrown and stiles and gates often difficult to negotiate in many cases

I don't use currently (bridleways) but would like to if clearly marked. I have so far been unable to find them

25 Road verges – well maintained?

Maintenance will mean different things to different people, but generally speaking, yes

Residents up High St have no cut communal grass but in other areas village grass cutting provided

Kerbstones non- existent or crumbling in many places in village. Excessive vegetation growth which is not dealt with

Verges on A169 are cut too late in year and become dangerous

They could be cut to allow for some walking in case of cars

Need street cleaning more often

Hudgin Lane used to have the verges further up the lane maintained with soakaways which drained the water off the lane. This is no longer done so when it rains all the water runs down the lane

Poor workmanship, not finished off properly, poor drainage

Yes – apart from the appearance of "garden" flowers around seats and signs and road junctions. These are to be abhorred

Could be cut more around the Back Lane and verge onto A169 should be cut more for visibility

The village always looks beautiful Only slight negative is the amount of dog mess left on country lanes/pavements

Normally yes, but (on the day of writing) they are looking in need of maintenance & a good cut to maintain the feel of the village

I have struggled to see traffic approaching when the grass was too long – out onto main road (A169)

26a Cycle Routes satisfied with access and condition

I have had to remanstrate (?) with motor bike (trial bikes) riders who clearly knew what they were up to – but continued to insist that they were on a bridleway – and not a footpath (from Mill to Levisham}

Some badly damaged by motorbikes

Cycling facilities generally in this part of the NY Moors is poor. Very few cycle ways. The new route from the Fox & Rabbit to Lockton is a big improvement though

More cycling facilities would be good (for locals and visitors)

The village noticeboards are not managed well unlike Levisham where access is limited to a key holder. Items which are still current sometimes mysteriously disappear?

Activities + groups in the village hall

29 Info pack – that would have been very helpful (newish residents)

Council Services

30. What improvements would you like to see?

Glass/Recycling often not collected and they miss a week making it a monthly collection

Brown bin collection should be free

Better if it was either Monday or Tuesday each week (not alternate weeks

Twice we have not had our bins emptied

The ability to recycle more eg. Tetra Packs

Free taking away of garden rubbish

Boxes and bins should not be put out on roadside until as late as possible. They are an eyesore, but are often seen 18 to 24 hours ahead of collection dates

There is no facility for glass recycling and it is taken back to Leeds!

As someone who comes and goes a lot, I find it difficult to use the refuse collection service. I mainly go to the tip, or take my refuse to my main residence

Fortnightly collections not very good, this hot weather bids have smelled. Maggots

Even though we pay full council tax we have only 1 bin with no option for any recycling (we do this ourselves at Thornton Le Dale tip). This has never been resolved for us

The service is good but I feel it is unfair to charge for garden waste. Some of us do not have easy access to alternative arrangements

31. Any other comments on Council Services

Don't have any others None of these services on David's Lane

Too many potholes and don't sweep street even when requested

Don't have street lighting

Too much street lighting in a Dark Skies Area?

There is already far too much

Would<u>not</u> like to see any further street lighting

Floods near Tea Rooms street lighting. Overly bright, operating all night and deeply intrusive in a village which is after all on the edge of a "dark skies" area – and the last village before the moors

Hudgin Lane used to have the verges further up the lane maintained with soakaways which drained the water off the lane. This is no longer done so when it rains all the water runs down the lane

Roads are in poor condition through the village. Leaves are left for a long period when they fall, causing drains to block, and footpaths become slippery in winter due to this

Snow ploughing and gritting – lack of snow plough and grit. No snow ploughing in the last batch of bad weather – not good enough (outside village)

Street Cleaning - Satisfied - except near Church in Autumn

Road Drainage - near cemetery

Snow clearance at the top end of the village is poor & gritting is not always done in this area.

Cleaning is adequate but done infrequently

We live on David's Lane, Lockton and receive no grit in the winter. Residents of the lane individually called the council to request the bins to be filled but they remain empty. This meant in the recent snow storms we were unable to get out in cars

Lack of salt in bad weather on side roads. Snow plough for pushing snow off roads

Traffic & Road Safety

32 Significant danger spots, where?

Playing Field

Stones Hill due to parked cars

People drive through at speed especially down Stoney Hill and past the junction with Hostess Lane. The Back Lane past the Playing Field is also an issue

20 mph through village?

Flooding on road into village can be hazardous in winter

Parked cars near shop

Drivers doing in excess of 30mph, between current 30 mph and A169 suggest limit should commence at road end

Road junction by

A169 Saltergate traffic going very fast especially motor bikes

Cars parked in inappropriate places – on junctions, on corners, at top of hills, makes it very difficult to access property if you can't see what is coming over hills or around corners

Hugdin Lane past play area currently national speed limit, used as a cut through for delivery vans to Levisham and residents, no pavement for people on foot

Inadequate signage near Children's Play Area.

Corner near to village

Brow of hill near Youth Hostel

A169 after Lockton Village

In the village by Tea-Room – some vehicles do not give way, Road marking needs improvement.

Speeds too high in Back Lane, past playground

Saltergate straight to Hole of Horcum

Purely down to speeding on lanes around the village, no speed restrictions

Fox & Rabbit to Thornton Dale Road – fast road

Traffic travelling too fast on Back Lane

Hugdin Lane – Tractors Farm Vehicles go too fast, cars cutting through also too fast, it would be better as a <u>one-way</u> system

Inappropriate speed into the village, either/and reduce speed past play areas/residents houses. 'Local traffic only' sign, re-instategive way signs, better signage on island leading to Levisham

By Tea Rooms – turning to Levisham

Junction opposite Tearooms (with road from Levisham)

Road next to playground – often speeding cars which do not slow down

By Play Area

Back Lane near Play Ares – people going too fast

On A169 where you turn into David Lane

The main road area seems to be used as a race-track by motor bikes on a summer's evening and weekend morning. I would be astonished if speeds do not often reach 100 miles/hour over the moors, and yet I see little police surveillance of this activity

Speeding through village

Cars travelling too fast through village

It should be a 20 mph speed limit

The junction with main road

Back Lane near Children's Play Area, vehicles tend to go too fast through there, and there are children, animals around this area. Needs to be a 30 mph limit

Traffic through centre of village can make children vulnerable eg. near Chestnut Tree

Should be double white lines on the A169 main road, and 20 mph in the village

Traffic entering village from Levisham taking bend too fast

Failing to slow quickly enough for 30 mph speed limit

Traffic travelling too fast on minor back roads

The turn to Levisham near Tearooms - parked cars on the bend and speeding traffic from Levisham

Back Lane by the Playing Field – speeding - especially delivery vans

Main Road junction - due to speed and visibility on A169

Back Lane past play area – needs speed restriction & better signage

Near VH

Lockton Bank corner

Junction with Whitby Road, by Cricket Field. Lot of speeding and overtaking on it. Also think it is a dangerous place for a bus stop

Speed of vehicle along Back Lane

Parking on both sides of bend near Reading Room

Mis-use of the Green triangle at the Levisham turning

Pulling out onto A169. Speeding cars/motor bikes coming from Whitby.

Cars / Bikes overtaking near junction (double white lines would stop this)

Traffic comes very fast at times from Whitby direction. The view is not good turning out of Lockton Lane end.

The top of Levisham road is an accident waiting to happen. A strong barrier is needed

33. Speeding a problem?

Cycling on A169 in summer. not pleasant

On evenings – racing form Pickering to Fox & Rabbit and down to Thornton Dale

Drivers on A169 (particularly motor cyclists) appear to totally unaware of the 60 mph limit

The urge for some drivers going north to overtake those turning left into the village is dangerous ans has/will cause head-On accidents

Fox & Rabbit to David Lane – because it is relatively straight and has four side roads all needing access onto and from the A169

Hudgin Lane through village

Hudgin Lane - Tractors Farm Vehicles go too fast, cars cutting through also too fast, it would be better as a <u>one-way</u> system

A169 Pickering to Lockton is like a race track morning (7am)

You see speed camera in Pickering but rarely on A169

Near Cricket Field on A169

Excessive speeding on the A169, also no 30mph restriction on lanes around village

Motor Bikes

Particulary motor bikes on A169

A169 - Speeding Motor Bikes

Cars passing through going too fast

Back Lane

Getting onto A169

Along the whole A169 route

By Children's Playing Park Area as there is a 60 mph limit

Past Playing Field

Stoney Hill to Hostess Lane

Require 20mph speed restriction thro village & Back Lane

Inappropriate speed into village on back road, reduce speed, 'local traffic only signs', better signage

By Tea Rooms

Hugdin Lane – going down to Levisham

On the straights, up to Hole of Horcum

A169 there should be double white lines at Lockton village road end – overtaking cars are a real danger to life

In the village there is no excuse for travelling at more than 20 mph.

On main road (A169) there are huge dangers caused by excessive speed (Motorbikes and cars at speeds in excess of 80/90 mph)

A169 – speeding and examples of poor driving/overtaking at junctions/bends seen almost daily on journeys. Police speed cameras wpould be better placed between Lockton and Pickering rather than in the 30 zone as you enter Pickering

Although we live in the Parish we don't live in Lockton so cannot answer all the questions

Lockton is a lovely place to live (30 yrs). The village has changed, a great deal, lots of new residents, very few younger residents but house prices and job availability mirrors this

Having the Tea Rooms is a great focal point and much appreciated

The village needs another dog foul bin east of the village

Lockton will do best if it remains as true to its' moorland origins as possible. There is creeping urbanisation all over: Tarmac driveways across village green; inappropriately styled windows (casement v sash) on some old properties; too many outside lights left on all evening (sometimes overnight)!; cars parked on the village green; cars (hunt horseboxes especially chewing up the verges opposite the cemetery this last winter-time).

PS What about setting up a Lockton website or social media page? The 'Heritage' website is utterly dull, difficult to find, awkward to navigate, and with <u>very</u> little information that is almost never updated. These are all <u>grass</u> errors in having a thriving communication. Something that is moderated (of course) but easily accessible and open for everyone to post articles, features, adverts, items of interest, at any time would be useful both within, and out with the village.

A very recent "addition" to the village is a satellite dish mounted on the front elevation of South Cottage on the main street leading up beyond the Tearooms, this is obtrusive and unattractive and diminishes the rural appearance of properties in the village. This is a holiday cottage – but with the satellite dish (and others elsewhere in the village) are detracting from the appeal of the village, to visitors as well as residents, and should be removed

There should be a village publication under the auspices of the Parish Council

Bring back the Lockton Cryer!

I feel there are too many empty second homes in the village

We <u>love</u> Lockton. It is a beautiful village with extremely friendly & welcoming residents. We wish we could live there permanently! (and may one day!)

It's a pleasure to live in such a beautiful & friendly village. We have very good neighbours which means a lot

It's good to have a thriving tearooms but I think local people would like to have a small convenience store – just for basics & non-perishable items perhaps
